On-Campus Equestrian Program

Catering to students of all abilities, the QMS Marquee Equestrian Program offers a well-balanced combination of stable management and riding skills designed to optimize experiential learning opportunities in a fun, safe and supportive environment. Whether riding a QMS school horse or their own horse stabled on campus, students can take advantage of an English-focused equestrian program that integrates seamlessly with their academic and extra-curricular activities.

For students seeking the thrill of competition, the QMS Marquee Equestrian Program provides opportunities throughout the year to participate in horse shows at the local, regional, and international levels, including participation in the US-based Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA) Program.

With optional credit-granted equine-focused theory courses available such as pre-veterinary Equine Science, Equestrian Management, and Introduction to Horse Training, the QMS Marquee Equestrian Program will prepare riders and non-riders alike for post-secondary schooling and future career opportunities in the Equine Industry.



Our Caring Boarding Community

Gender-specific residences are steps away from the academic, athletic, equestrian, and fine arts facilities. After school and weekend activities continue the development of independence and responsibility and enrich social and cultural interactions. These are supported by boarding staff who live on campus full-time, a school nurse and counselor.

Additional levels of activities, supervision and emotional support are provided for our younger boarders in Grades 7 and 8. With many QMS day students living near the school, boarding students are closely connected to Canadian families and culture.

Our QMS community is enhanced with the languages, cultures and perspectives of families from 26 countries: Australia, Austria, Canada, China, Costa Rica, Egypt, England, Finland, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Israel, Japan, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Philippines, Russia, Scotland, South Africa, South Korea, Switzerland, Thailand, the United States, Vietnam and Wales.

Our unique programming

We use our 30-acre campus and our local and global communities to serve as living classrooms where “learning by doing” encourages students to apply their knowledge to complex, real-world challenges. Three signature programming strategies guide our faculty in the delivery of an enriched curriculum.

Entrepreneurial Thinking

We prepare young minds for the future by encouraging them to see the world through different perspectives. By applying foundational coursework to real world problems, students are guided in entrepreneurial and innovative thinking, collaborating, incubating ideas, designing and experimenting, and finally prototyping solutions that tackle larger societal challenges.

Experiential & Inquiry-based Learning

Our approach places students’ questions, ideas and observations at the centre of the learning experience. Through open-ended investigations, students build their knowledge and deepen their understanding by making reasonable connections, developing evidence-based research skills, and proposing creative solutions.

Sustainability & Environmental Stewardship

With access to an abundant 30-acre campus, school farm and Cowichan Valley, our students have ample opportunities to learn about environmental stewardship and sustainability through hands-on, place-based experiences. There is no better place to learn about food security, sustainable innovation and climate change initiatives when Vancouver Island is our backyard.

Visual and Performing Arts




The QMS Prep Program

This tailored-made program is designed to prepare mission appropriate students in Grades 7 to 10 with full-time English Language needs for entry into mainstream academic courses at QMS for the following year. Students are provided with opportunities to develop their academic reading, writing, speaking and listening skills. Additionally, students will develop subject-specific vocabulary to assist with comprehension while learning to adapt to Canadian culture and curriculum before enrolling in the mainstream academic program. Upon completion of this one year program, students will be awarded a certificate of completion; however, school credits will not be provided as this is a skill-based learning year.
