<sup>2</sup> Boarding students are required to have \$5,000 CAD pocket money (or an "allowance") in place before (or upon) student arrival. Parent(s) may deposit a lump sum of money or place a credit card on file with the Finance Department.

## ADDITIONAL FEE AND ENROLMENT INFORMATION

### ELIGIBILITY FOR CANADIAN FEES:

Fees are based on the primary residence (outside of Canada) of the parent(s) and are not defined by the student's passport.

To qualify for Local Day fees, a student must be/have:

- A dependent of a Canadian Citizen(s).
- A dependent of a Permanent Resident(s).
- Have a parent(s) with a valid Study Permit or Work permit.
- Have a parent(s) with diplomatic status.

### INTERNATIONAL BOARDING STUDENTS WILL REQUIRE:

1. **A Valid Study Permit:** International students must obtain a study permit, valid for the academic year. Once the student has received their copy, a copy must be emailed to [admissions@qms.bc.ca](mailto:admissions@qms.bc.ca) prior to arrival on campus. Without a valid study permit, students will not be eligible to receive credits towards their [Dogwood Diploma](#).
2. **International Student Guardianship Canada:** [Citizenship and Immigration Canada](#) requires international students, studying in Canada, to have a legal guardian who is a Canadian citizen, hold a PR card, hold a valid work permit, and/or study permit. All international boarding students must have a guardian representative living in Canada, who are able to give consent and sign waivers on behalf of the student's parents.

International students will be required to enrol under the guardianship of International Student Guardianship Canada (ISGC). The dedicated ISGC guardian will remain in communication with student(s), parent(s), and school staff throughout the academic year(s). The ISGC guardian will help student(s) and parent(s) with any emergencies, communications, and translations (if required) between the family and the school; actively engaging in the overall success of each student in their care.

### STUDENTS WHO HOLD A CANADIAN PASSPORT, BUT RESIDE ABROAD FULL-TIME WILL REQUIRE:

1. **BC Medical Services Plan:** students who hold a Canadian Passport are eligible to enroll under BC's Medical Services Plan (MSP). In the interim, students will be required to purchase Private Insurance until MSP is available. 2. **International Student Guardianship Canada (ISGC):** [Citizenship and Immigration Canada](#) requires international students, studying in Canada, to have a legal guardian who is a Canadian citizen, hold a PR card, hold a work permit, and/or study permit. All international boarding students must have a guardian representative living in Canada, who are able to give consent and sign waivers on behalf of the student's parents.

Canadian Boarding students whose parent(s)/legal guardian(s) reside outside of Canada, will be required to enrol their child under the guardianship of International Student Guardianship Canada (ISGC). The dedicated ISGC guardian will remain in communication with student(s), parent(s), and school staff throughout the academic year(s). The ISGC guardian will help student(s) and parent(s) with any emergencies, communications, and translations (if required) between the family and the school; actively engaging in the overall success of each student in their care.

### STUDENT DEFERRALS

Applicants may be eligible for a **one-time** opportunity to defer enrolment to the next academic year.

To be considered for enrolment deferral, the student must:

- Accept the Admissions Department's offer of admission, which includes:
- Submission of the completed, and signed, Annual Registration Contract and,
- Paid the non-refundable Enrolment Deposit
- Enroled students requesting a deferral, must send their request in writing; with reason, and submit by email to [admissions@qms.bc.ca](mailto:admissions@qms.bc.ca).
- Deferrals will be approved by the Director of Admissions and is subject to available space the following academic year.
- If a student requests deferral a second year, they may be subject to losing their Enrolment Deposit paid and have to apply again.
- International students facing delays in obtaining their Study Permit will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
